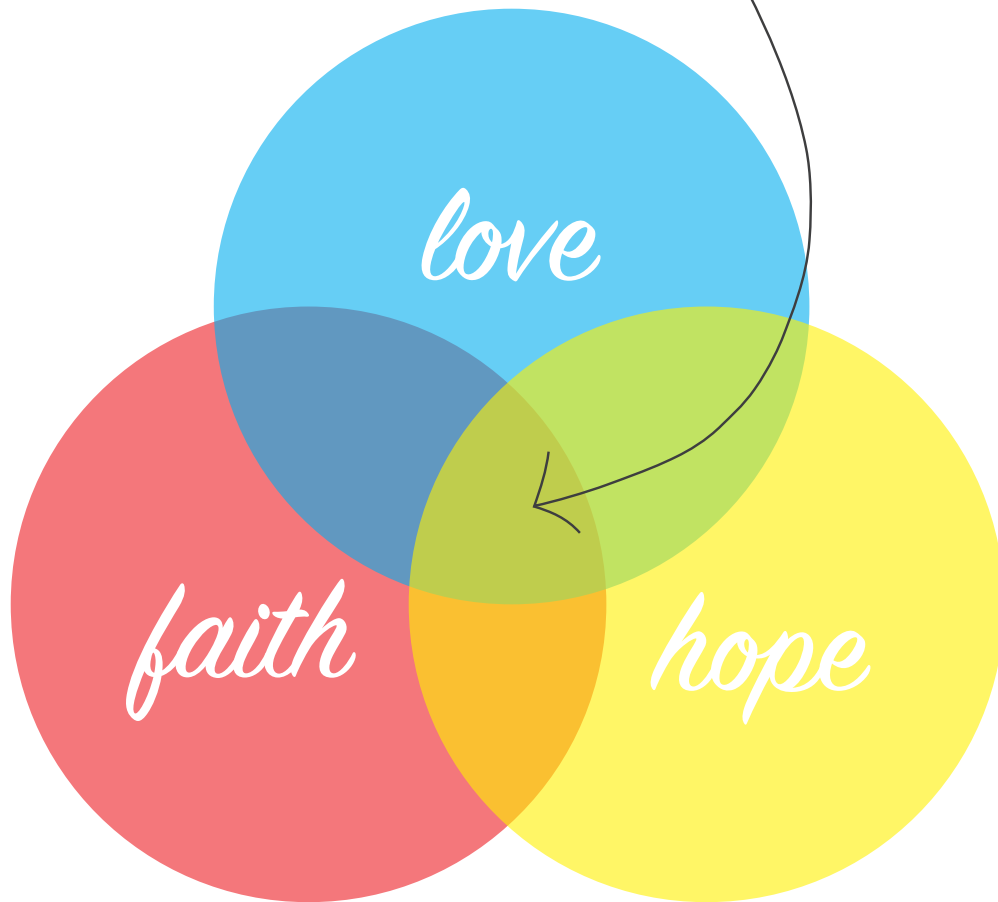

Despite the ubiquity of crucifixion across the Roman world, few cared to think much about it. [...] Some deaths were so vile, so squalid, that it was best to raw a veil across them entirely. The surprise, then, is less that we should have so few detailed descriptions in ancient literature of what a crucifixion might actually involve, than that we should have any at all. [...] Nevertheless, amid the general silence, there is one major exception which proves the rule. Four detailed accounts of the process by which a man might be sentenced to the cross, and then suffer his punishment, have survived from antiquity. Remarkably, they all describe the same execution ...

You will notice that for our service this Good Friday we are using the rich and somewhat archaic language of the Book of Common Prayer. The Book of Common Prayer has been the foundational prayer book of Anglican Christianity since the book's introduction in the Church of England during a revolutionary time of reform in the middle of the 16th century. To this day the Book of Common Prayer in its year 1662 version remains "the authorised standard of worship and doctrine" of the Anglican Church of Australia. We still use it every week at the St Philip's 8:30am service.

Because Good Friday commemorates the crucifixion of the Son of God for our sins, it is a very solemn if also joyful day. We have chosen to use Book of Common Prayer this day because its self-consciously formal and highly crafted prose is appropriate for such an occasion and because, despite its unfamiliarity to many, it can still powerfully speak to us as we attend to it.

Exhortation

Dearly beloved, the Scripture moveth us, in sundry places, to acknowledge and confess our manifold sins and wickedness; and that we should not dissemble nor cloak them before the face of Almighty God our heavenly Father; but confess them with an humble, lowly, penitent, and obedient heart; to the end that we may obtain forgiveness of the same, by his infinite goodness and mercy. And although we ought at all times humbly to acknowledge our sins before God; yet ought we most chiefly so to do, when we assemble and meet together to render thanks for the great benefits that we have received at his hands, to set forth his most worthy praise, to hear his most holy Word, and to ask those things which are requisite and necessary, as well for the body as the soul. Wherefore I pray and beseech you, as many as are here present, to accompany me with a pure heart, and humble voice, unto the throne of the heavenly grace, saying after me:

General Confession

Almighty and most merciful Father;

We have erred, and strayed from thy ways like lost sheep.

We have followed too much the devices and desires of our own hearts.

We have offended against thy holy laws.

We have left undone those things which we ought to have done;

And we have done those things which we ought not to have done;

And there is no health in us.

But thou, O Lord, have mercy upon us miserable offenders.

Spare thou them, O God, which confess their faults.

Restore thou them that are penitent;

According to thy promises declared unto mankind in Christ Jesu our Lord.

And grant, O most merciful Father, for his sake;

That we may hereafter live a godly, righteous, and sober life,

To the glory of thy holy name. Amen.

Almighty God, the Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who desireth not the death of a sinner, but rather that he may turn from his wickedness, and live; and hath given power and commandment to his Ministers, to declare and pronounce to his people, being penitent, the Absolution and Remission of their sins : He pardoneth and absolveth all them that truly repent and unfeignedly believe his holy Gospel. Wherefore let us beseech him to grant us true repentance, and his Holy Spirit, that those things may please him which we do at this present; and that the rest of our life hereafter may be pure and holy; so that at the last we may come to his eternal joy; through Jesus Christ our Lord.

New Testament Lesson

Mark 15:20b-39

²⁰ ... Then they led him out to crucify him.

²¹ A certain man from Cyrene, Simon, the father of Alexander and Rufus, was passing by on his way in from the country, and they forced him to carry the cross. ²² They brought Jesus to the place called Golgotha (which means ‘the place of the skull’). ²³ Then they offered him wine mixed with myrrh, but he did not take it. ²⁴ And they crucified him. Dividing up his clothes, they cast lots to see what each would get.

²⁵ It was nine in the morning when they crucified him. ²⁶ The written notice of the charge against him read: the king of the jews.

²⁷ They crucified two rebels with him, one on his right and one on his left.

²⁸ Those who passed by hurled insults at him, shaking their heads and saying, ‘So! You who are going to destroy the temple and build it in three days, ³⁰ come down from the cross and save yourself!’ ³¹ In the same way the chief priests and the teachers of the law mocked him among themselves. ‘He saved others,’ they said, ‘but he can’t save himself! ³² Let this Messiah, this king of Israel, come down now from the cross, that we may see and believe.’ Those crucified with him also heaped insults on him.

³³ At noon, darkness came over the whole land until three in the afternoon.

³⁴ And at three in the afternoon Jesus cried out in a loud voice, ‘Eloi, Eloi, lema sabachthani?’ (which means ‘My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?’).

³⁵ When some of those standing near heard this, they said, ‘Listen, he’s calling Elijah.’

³⁶ Someone ran, filled a sponge with wine vinegar, put it on a staff, and offered it to Jesus to drink. ‘Now leave him alone. Let’s see if Elijah comes to take him down,’ he said.

³⁷ With a loud cry, Jesus breathed his last.

³⁸ The curtain of the temple was torn in two from top to bottom. ³⁹ And when the centurion, who stood there in front of Jesus, saw how he died, he said, ‘Surely this man was the Son of God!’

CITY CARE & Covid-19

The plight of people living on the streets of Sydney with the rise of Covid-19 isn't great. Our City's marginalised run a higher risk of contracting the virus and many food vans and homeless services are drying up due to a lack of volunteers, economic upheaval and the health risks involved.

After seeking advice from Sydney City Council the City Care team is determined to double-down on our efforts to support our City Care regulars during this difficult season.

OUR PLAN FOR CITY CARE LUNCH ON SUNDAY 19 APRIL

City Care will run on a takeaway-only basis gifting shopping bags filled with hygiene essentials, non-perishable food items and 'groceries only' gift cards to all-comers. Excess bags will be distributed at several homelessness hot-spots throughout the City.

We will also seek contact details from our regulars and encourage them to let us know how we can help them more specifically over the coming months.

What we need from you

We need you to purchase (and arrange for delivery to St Philip's, 3 York Street Sydney 2000):

- Hygiene essentials (e.g. hand sanitiser, masks, wipes, travel tissues, tampons, lip balm, beauty products, razors etc.)
- Non-perishable food items (e.g. salmon/tuna/ham/corned beef cans – ring pull only, baked beans – ring pull only, tuna and crackers, muesli/granola/nut bars, fruit snacks/dried fruit/trail mix, instant soups & noodles, long life milk, coffee/tea bags, chocolate, lollies, chips etc.)
- Woolworths 'groceries only' gift cards. \$25 denominations only.

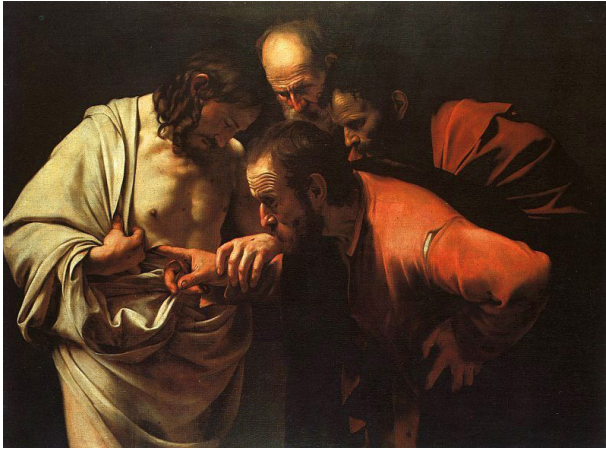
